- Bowling is an Independent Provider Activity at Burnsville High School. Bowling is co-ed activity in the fall and a girls-only activity in the winter. **Members of the bowling teams are eligible for varsity letters.**
- Brunswick Zone XL is the sponsoring bowling center for the Burnsville High School bowling teams. Brunswick Zone provides lanes for practices and conference competition. During a single season high school bowlers will receive literally hundreds of dollars of bowling and instruction for just \$75.00.
- Practices are held at Brunswick Zone XL on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. Matches are held on Saturday afternoons at bowling centers in the south metro area. During the regular season Burnsville will compete against some/all of these schools: Apple Valley, Bloomington Jefferson, Bloomington Kennedy, Eagan, Eastview, Lakeville North, and Lakeville South.
- It is the opinion of many that Minnesota High School Bowling and Girls Minnesota High School Bowling are the best-organized club programs in the state. In the fall of 2011, the co-ed league had 134 varsity and 110 junior varsity teams (more than 1675 students) competing throughout the state. The girls-only league was started up just two years ago and in the winter of 2012, the girls-only league had 33 varsity teams (230 students) competing statewide.
- Minnesota High School Bowling uses the baker-system. Five bowlers each bowl two frames to complete a single game. **It is a very exciting format for both players and spectators.**
- Minnesota High School Bowling and Girls Minnesota High School Bowling are administered by the Bowling Proprietors Association (BPAM) and are governed by a set of rules that have been modeled after those of the Minnesota State High School League.
